Good Sam and Extra Table Seek Volunteers To Unload 37 Tons of Donated Food

JACKSON, Miss. -August 31, 2020- Hub for the Hungry, powered by Good Sam and Extra Table, will receive 74,000 pounds of donated food from Dot Foods Thursday at 9 a.m. The organizations are seeking volunteers to help get the job done safely and efficiently. Donations will be unloaded at Good Sam's back parking lot.

This volunteer opportunity is open to all who are able and willing. Any amount of time volunteered will be appreciated. Volunteers can message Good Samaritan Center on social media or call the front office to RSVP. All participants must wear a mask.

Extra Table Executive Director, Martha Allen, says she is excited to be partnering with Dot Foods and looks forward to the massive impact this new partnership will make on Mississippians from all over.

"I'm ecstatic Dot Foods will be joining our Hub for the Hungry collaboration! We have gone from spring, to summer, and are turning the corner into fall, still facing the effects of COVID-19. Continued donations of food are critically important and a donation like this of monumental size will have a grand impact supporting our partnered efforts to get food to food pantries state-wide," Allen said.

With this great new partnership, comes a great new need for volunteers, especially this Thursday, as emphasized by Allen.

"74,000 pounds! That's SO much food - two 53' trucks, one refrigerated and one frozen. It's super exciting, but we're going to need all the help we can get this Thursday. Come one, come all – the more the merrier but wear your mask," Allen said.


